

Partly unpaid entire letter from Cristianssand (dated May 5th 1828) to Antwerpen in Belgium via Frederiksværn-Copenhagen by s/s "Prinds Carl", Copenhagen, "HAMBURG 27 MAY 1828" and Almelo. In Almelo, linear "HAMBURG". Weight manuscript "1 1/2". Prepaid to Hamburg, as manuscripted "Frc. Hamburg". Postage due in Antwerpen "65" Centimes. At arrival marked "5-31" (May 31st). This postmark was used in Antwerpen during the years 1824 to 1830. This item is the only one known to Belgium from Norway until 1848, however, not registred in Snarvold (2003).



3-circle numeral cancellation "63" (Farsund) on a single copy of 2 sk. together with a horizontal strip of four of 8 sk. Oscar and marked "FARSUND 30-4-1857". The entire letter has been franked in compliance with the 1854-convention between France and Norway. 34 sk. = 1 Fr. (French postage) and 60 c. (Norwegian postage). Obviously, the entire letter has instead been shipped via Hamburg and from there by Th. & T. (as marked on the reverse) post through Austria to the Austrian-Roman boarder. Black "Transito per lo Stato Ponitifico" (reverse) was marked in Milan (Italy), and stated that the rate only was partly paid to the income boarder of the Papal States, and the full rate Papal States + Naples equal "38" Grana to be collected from the reciver. "3" Sgr. is the German postage. This item is the only one known adhesive entire letter to Italy from Agder until 1875, however not registred in Wasenden (1994)).
