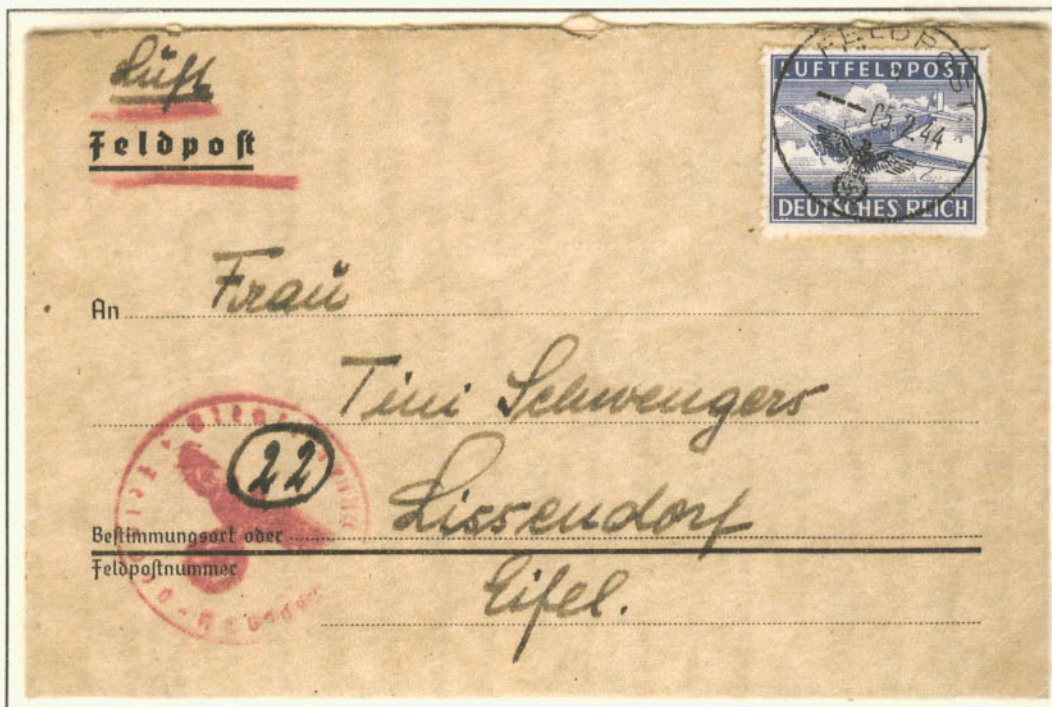
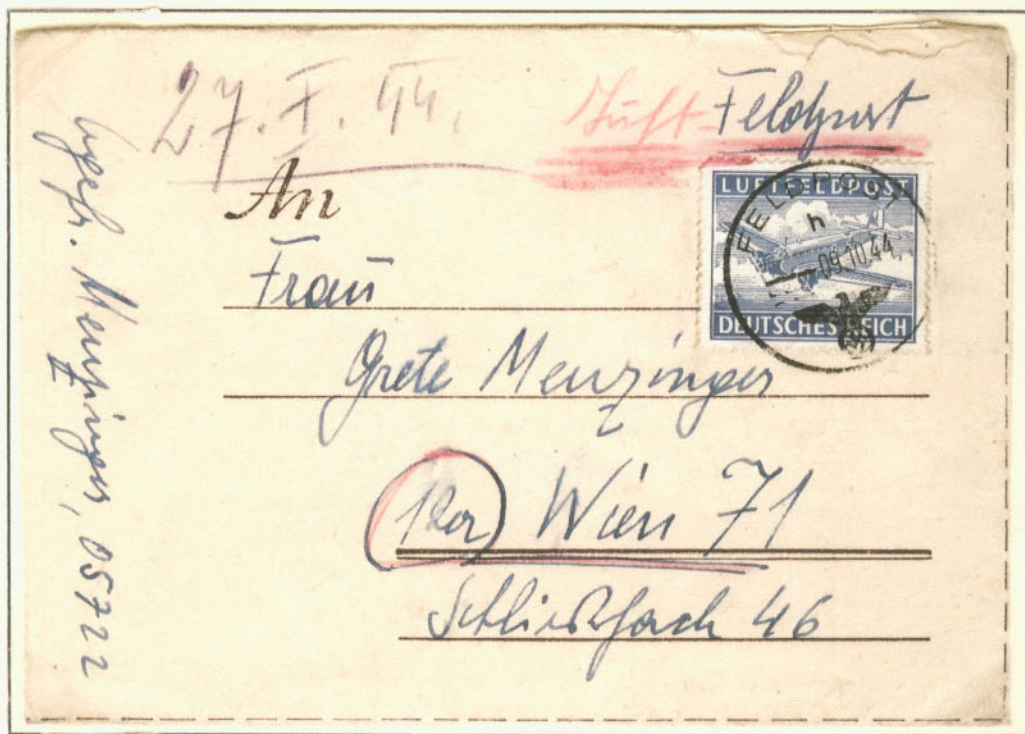


A German airmail field post service to Northern Norway and Lapland was established in September 1943. The soldiers got 8 "zulassungsmarken" (Lupo stamps) each month to be used when sending letters home - and backwards. 1 Lupo stamp was required to send a field post folder (<5 g) and 2 Lupo stamps to send a field post letter (< 10 g) [in effect from September 1943 to January 25th 1945, according to German regulations]
